Penance: Confessions are heard 30 minutes before each Mass.

Baptism: Please call Father in advance to arrange for a Baptism. One parent and the Sponsors must be practicing Traditional Catholics.

Matrimony: For practicing Traditional Catholics only. Please contact Father at least 6 months before the wedding date for marriage instructions. The best man and maid of honor should be Catholics, since they act as witnesses to the marriage.

Confirmation: Please let Father know if there is a need for Confirmation, so that he may inform Bishop Pivarunas to arrange a time.

Rosary: The Rosary will be prayed 20 minutes prior to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

Mass Stipends: Mass intentions may be submitted to Father. The customary stipend is **\$25.00**. If you wish to have Mass offered on a specific date, please submit well in advance (at least a month).

Dress Code

Out of respect for the Blessed Sacrament, and in keeping with Christian modesty, please observe the following standards of dress:

Women and girls must have their heads covered. A suitable hat or veil should be used. Slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted. Dresses and skirts must cover the knees completely when standing or seated. Men and boys should wear a suit-coat and tie. Jeans, shorts, flip-flops and other casual attire are inappropriate for church. Please also avoid clothing with logos and/or large lettering, as these can be quite distracting. Announcements

- **This February 14th Father Geckle will take care of the Missions in Oklahoma. This will provide our Parishes with a visiting confessor.**
- **This Ash Wednesday the Holy season of Lent begins. This is a season to do penance for our sins, and to ask God for mercy, not only for ourselves, but also for our countries and the whole world. The practice of penance is necessary to save our souls. Holy Mother the Church in her wisdom establishes this season of mandatory mortification, in order to lead us, as it where, by the hand, in the practice of this virtue. The Laws established by the Church in regards fast and abstinence are as follows:**

Abstinence:

- 1.-Everyone over seven years of age is bound to observe the laws of abstinence.
- 2.-Complete abstinence is to be observed on Fridays, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigils of the Immaculate Conception and Christmas. On days of complete abstinence, meat and soup or gravy made from meat may not be used at all.
- 3.-Partial Abstinence is to be observed on Ember Wednesdays and Saturdays and on the vigil of Pentecost. On days of partial abstinence, meat and soup or gravy made from meat may be taken only once a day at the principal meal.

Fast:

- 1.-Everyone over 21 and under 59 years of age is also bound to observe the law of fast.
 - 2.-The days of fast are the weekdays of Lent, including Holy Saturday, the Ember Days and the Vigils of Pentecost, the Immaculate Conception and Christmas.
 - 3.-On days of Fast, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs; but together they should not equal another full meal.
 - 4.-Meat may be taken at the principal meal on a day of fast except on Fridays, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigils of the Immaculate Conception and Christmas.
 - 5.-Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.
 - 6.-Where health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a parish Priest or confessor should be consulted.
- There is no obligation for fast or abstinence on a holy Day of Obligation.
